# Hobro: Buryat Shaman's Horse Staffs

Made from either wood or iron, these are essential tools of a Black shaman, held in each hand while they go into trance and journey to the spirit worlds. They are looked after by a Master Spirit called Khotokhon.

Grandfather Sky loved Grandmother Earth and wanted to marry her, but Grandfather Sky had a brother called Khotokhon who also loved Grandmother Earth. But Grandmother Earth choose Grandfather Sky, and so in dispair Khotokhon fled far away, into the sky, and there a star, far out in the sky, fell in love with him, and taught him compassion and healed his heart. And so Khotokhon returned to earth to help open the roads to the spirit world for all shamans, and he gave them each a pair of horse spirits, called hobro, on which to ride.
